



## 2026 PROSPECTIVE BOARD MEMBER INFORMATION

### **ABOUT US**

For over 36 years, Store to Door (S2D) has supported independent living for homebound seniors and adults living with disabilities in the Portland Metro area. Our program provides approximately 500 clients annually with food access, food security, social connection, and community support. S2D envisions our community to be an equitable and supported place where all seniors and adults living with disabilities are nourished, included, and can age with dignity in the setting of their own choice. Nearly 1,000 individuals annually provide over 20,000 volunteer hours to support the following programs: personalized grocery delivery, free food box delivery, friendly calls, and closed-loop referrals. Our 2025 operating budget is approximately one million dollars, comprised of support from corporate sponsorships (16%), private, family, and corporate foundations (52%), government (5%), individual donations (13%), earned income, and fees (14%). We launched a three-year strategic plan to guide our growth, and the board is currently developing a plan to guide the next three years. According to our latest impact survey, 96% of clients report that our collective services are essential (66%) or important (30%) for their independence. Without our services, many clients would experience increased social isolation, a lower quality of life, premature institutionalization, or, in some cases, homelessness.

### **Our Board**

Our board has 10-12 members representing a mix of skills and experience. The board aims to provide strategic advice, provide strong program and fiscal governance, and extend our organization's social and civic reach. Board Members commit to an year of service (Jan-Dec), with the option to renew annually. The Board generally meets monthly on the 4<sup>th</sup> Thursday of the month from 11:30-1:00 (lunch not provided). Meetings are held at the Store to Door office in Multnomah Village with an option to join by TEAMS video conference. The board currently has two active committees, Executive and Finance, that supports strategy and operations. However, additional committees may be set. Board members are encouraged to serve on at least one committee. While the board does not have a specific financial requirement for membership, our board members are expected to make personal commitments to the organization through donations, civic reach and support as we seek foundation and corporate support. All board members sign an annual conflict of interest statement and are expected to actively participate in meetings and advocate for the organization, the needs of aging seniors, and the need for increased support of the services we provide.

### **Open Positions**

The S2D Board is currently comprised of 10-12 members, bringing a range of expertise to the organization, including finance, project management, human resources, technology, nonprofits, and healthcare. We seek to add 2 to 3 management-level professionals with expertise in aging and disability services, healthcare systems, fundraising and philanthropy, and community partnerships. For our board positions, we also recognize that our strength is connected to the expanding diversity of board members. If you have expertise in other areas, please talk with us about service
